

FAST FORMATION PROFICIENCY REPORT



One of the most important responsibilities of the Lead Pilot is to document the currency and competency of the formation pilots with whom he/she flies. This FPR form is the national tool used to track currency compliance.

Flight Lead/Check Pilots: You may not endorse yourself; another Lead/Check qualified pilot in the flight must observe you leading through a cross section of all basic formation maneuvers contained in the applicable FAST Practical Test Guide (PTG). This form allows multiple Lead/Check qualified pilots participating in the flight to complete all FPR requirements using one form – simply conduct applicable lead change requirements and check, in the space provided, the position(s) flown. All Wing pilots will fly in the wing position for currency. Each pilot's signature testifies that he/she has flown in the position indicated. The flight lead's signature below also indicates he/she has observed the listed pilots and verified that, on the date indicated, they met the standards of the FAST PTG for Lead Pilot and/or Wing Pilot. The endorsing Lead/Check Pilot(s) may provide additional training, if necessary, and must ensure that any pilot he/she has endorsed as current has participated in the formation flight in a safe and standardized manner, in accordance with FAST standards. If any pilot in the flight was unable to perform to the required FAST standards, or is not FAST qualified, his/her name should not be listed on this form.
